

NATIONAL FINALS IN SPELLING!

There have been some outstanding results in the Prime Minister's Spelling Bee. Students taking part in the Spelling Bee are given 30 random words from their reading level word list, with 25 seconds to spell each word. Students may not be familiar with all the words they are asked to spell. However, exposing students to new words and their definitions helps expand their vocabularies and encourages them to continue reading.

GUEST SPEAKER

As part of the Year 10 HSIE study of the Vietnam War, Year 10 students had the opportunity to attend a talk given by Tony Hoang. Tony spoke to the students about the struggles that the Vietnamese community faced when they fled Vietnam after the war, and settled in Australia.

At 13, Tony was making \$10,000 a week dealing heroin. His cousins were members of 5T, a well-known crime gang in Cabramatta, and as a teenager, Tony began dealing drugs outside Cabramatta station.

His adolescence was punctuated by time in and out of juvenile detention, and later, by his own addiction. At 21, Tony hit rock bottom and he returned to the church he'd been to every Sunday as a child and asked God for a sign.

What came next was more literal than he could have imagined. Tony is now a Pastor at a Christian Church in Fairfield with six kids of his own.

Tony's story has been broadcast in two national documentaries and continues to make an impact throughout various media platforms with worldwide networks and partnerships. He has spoken at over 100 schools across Australia, New Zealand, Fiji, Vietnam and the United States.

FIGURING OUT WHAT'S UP WITH YOUR TEENAGER



ASK THEM TO ANSWER THIS QUESTION

'How are you on a scale of 1 to 10?'
(1 = pretty awful and 10 = smiles all round.)



IF THEY ANSWERED 7 OR ABOVE

Awesome! Ask them what's going well in their world, and remind them of these things the next time their score is low.



IF THEY ANSWERED 4 OR LOWER

Ask them what might need to happen to bring them up to a 7. Check out ReachOut.com together for some advice.



ASK REGULARLY

It'll help you to spot trends and act quickly.

Tips for creating a safe and trusting conversation:



LET THEM SPEAK

Give them time and space to talk, and avoid interrupting them.



REMOVE DISTRACTIONS

Put away your phone and give them your full attention.



ACKNOWLEDGE THEIR FEELINGS

Respond with comments like 'That must have been hard' or 'Sounds like it was exciting'.



GIVE PHYSICAL CUES

Nodding, making eye contact and facing the person you're talking with show that you're really listening.



PLAN FOR LATER

Ask them if they'd like to chat about the issue again, and lock it in.
