

Since 2020 WMCC has been awarded **three** National Championships in the REA Foundation and Department of Defence run STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) Technology Challenge Competitions.

2023 sees the launch of four new teams in the F1 in Schools and SUBS in Schools competitions. These are international competitions which involve developing, manufacturing and testing either a Formula 1 type car or a submarine.
